Sermons and Service Times in Church and Online

Although we are now starting to have regular services in our churches again, the current guidance is still to keep them as short as possible, so for the time being sermons will remain online only. Once this changes we will return to having a live sermon (and it is good to know that some of you have missed this!). We will continue to live stream a communion service every Sunday as well as other special services but please keep an eye on the weekly sheets and our website as times may vary from week to week. One other consequence of returning to more regular services is that we have had to think about service times - not just how long services will last when we can return to congregational singing and live sermons, but also how much time is needed to get safely from one church to another. We would also like to have time to talk to you after a service and not just race off to the next church.

We are also learning from the experience of having had different service times in some churches over the past year. There is a lot to process. For this reason we are experimenting with 10:45am services in St Andrew's this month and possibly into June. We hope to settle into a consistent pattern of services and service times from September. Please bear with us while we find a safe way of working beyond the immediate problems of the pandemic.
