#### **Christmas Message**

It is the days after Christmas that put the message of the mystery of God's incarnation to the test and show us God's love even in the darkest of times.

It is very easy to think of God's love for us in the warm glow of the fairy lights and tinsel, and in the slumbering satisfaction of a post-Christmas Dinner glass of something festive. On Christmas day our thoughts are on the scene around the manger, a happy holy family. But the days that follow paint a rather different picture:

Boxing Day is the commemoration of St Stephen.

St Stephen was the first Christian martyr, stoned to death as he speaks about his faith in Jesus. Saul, who was to become St Paul, holding the cloaks of those who threw the stones. Good King Wenceslas looked out on this day and was moved to his act of Christian charity on seeing the poor man gathering his winter fuel in the snow.

On 27th December, we commemorate St John.

John was the only one of Jesus' apostles not put to death for his faith. John takes Jesus' mother Mary into his own home after the crucifixion, and he lives to a ripe old age. For those who have lost beloved members of their family, for those who know the infirmity of old age, St John's Day can be a reminder, in this Christmastide, that you are not alone.

28th December commemorates the Holy Innocents, the victims of King Herod's rage at the birth of Christ.

It is exactly this kind of injustice and the unrestrained abuse of power, that Jesus will take on in his adult life. He teaches us, in words and with his life, about another Kingdom - God's kingdom of mercy, peace, and love.

I am so glad that beyond the tinsel, glitter, and frivolity of the Christmas Day festivities, these three days set the Nativity of Jesus in its proper context, the real life and pain of our world. This is truly "Good News of Great Joy to All the World". Gloria in Excelsis and Deo Gracias!
